Gold medals honour achievement in television and film

A total of 102 gold medals have been handed out as part of the 53rd New York Festivals International Television & Film Awards.

The prestigious accolades were given out by a Grand Jury of industry professionals for distinguished work in factual, arts and drama programming.

Gold medal winners ESPN of the United States and the United Kingdom's the Edge Picture Company also picked up Grand Trophy awards in the History & Society and Arts & Humanities categories.

ESPN's winning film - which collected one of ten gold medals for the company - was Muhammad & Larry, a documentary following the build-up to Muhammad Ali's world heavyweight championship match against his sparring partner Larry Holmes in 1980.

The Edge Picture Company won the Grand Trophy for its gold medal-winning entry [1,001 Inventions and the Library of Secrets](#), which looked at the scientific heritage of the Muslim world and was used as the introductory film at the 1,001 Inventions exhibition at the Science Museum in London.

Elsewhere, the Grand Jury and the United Nations Department of Public Information gave a gold medal prize to Canadian broadcaster CTV News for its film Pakistan Beauty Salon.
