This exhibition features over 80 photographs by Luis Márquez (1899-1978), the official photographer for and art adviser of the Mexican Pavilion at the 1939-40 World's Fair. Márquez fostered the image of a folkloric Mexico in photographic styles ranging from anthropological document to ironic theatrical tableau-vivant, often posing Pavilion dancers in their elaborate folk costumes against the ultra-modern World's Fair pavilion architecture.
